## Paella and zapekanka

I guess you all want to know more about Spanish and Russian traditional food. So you've got an opportunity.

*Can you please tell us something about features of the Spanish food?*

Manuel: Oil. We eat sunflower and olive oil. Also eggs. Spanish omelet usually is made of eggs and potatoes. Some people add ham, but you can use whatever you want. Also in my south region of Spain we eat a lot of fruits and vegetables, also paella. Paella is like rice with seafood. Also gazpacho. Gazpacho is made of tomatoes, garlic and some other vegetables, which makes this dish not spicy.



Some people also add bread. It is a soup, but some people take it as a dish and some as a drink, like my family does. *Have you ever found something similar between Russian and Spanish food?*

Enrique: Russian food is not different, it is just strange. You add potatoes in everything, we don't use it so much. Also you always drink tea, in Spain we drink just water.

*Is there something interesting for you in Russian food?*

Pedro: There is nothing interesting in Russian food. In fact, I like Russian food, but not everything. For example, the soup for lunch was delicious, meat too, but sometimes Russians prepare food in very strange ways. Sweets – yes, I love sweets. *What in your opinion is the most delicious dish in Spain? Is it hard to cook?*

Pedro: Paella. You can put there almost whatever you want, but it's difficult, because if you put it in fire for too long or too short – it's going to be bad. Paella is many rice with seafood, pork or chicken and some vegetables too. The rice has to be soft enough. You have to prepare all the meat and vegetables together. Then you have to carefully prepare the rice. It is cooked in a very big dish. If you are not careful enough, the rice could be too soft or too much hard, so it won't be tasty.
